His many innovative designs revolutionised crossbow manufacturing internationally, and are still the major source of inspiration to crossbow designers today.


The Horton Story tells of his lifelong interest in the many facets of manufacturing crossbows, his passion for hunting and for game management.

Apex Gear AXIM Series Sight

When I bought my last bow my dealer asked me whether I would like to use a bow sight from Apex.

Until that time I was not really aware of that brand and their sights and gear, which belong to TruGlo.

To be precise, he proposed the Axim Series Sight. All I can say is that it was a good decision to follow his recommendation. It is a sturdy, easy to install, well and accurately produced sight with a large circular field of view of 1,8-inch diameter, which I like because I prefer to see my sight through the peep. The tool-less design makes it easy to adjust and the laser markings and ultra-fine click adjustments for windage, elevation and pin adjustments are very comfortable and precise. I like the pin brightness and vertical adjustability size very much, as well as its compactness. With the glow-in-thedark shooter's ring and the push-button micro-light this sight is also well equipped for low-light conditions. If you need more magnification you can insert as accessory a 1,87-inch scope lens. I chose the 4-pin sight Lost Camo version with 0,010 pins, but you can get it as a 4-pin or 6-pin sight with 0,019 or 0,010 pins and in black, Realtree apg or Lost Camo

colour or the six-pin sight as well with a bronze detachable bracket. Last but not least, it is versatile and adjustable for right-handed and left-handed users. Check it out under http://apex-gear.com.
