### A comfortable harness for binoculars, cameras or rangefinders

This Safari Classic Harness system is a high quality, light comfortable harness used for carrying binoculars, cameras and a rangefinder. All of these items may be attached to the harness and carried at the same time or individually if you would prefer. All attachments are supplied with the product. It is designed for hunters to relieve neck strain as it enables you to carry heavy cameras, binoculars and rangefinders on walk-and-stalk or whilst sitting in the hide without suffering. Its exclusive concept distributes the weight onto the back and the shoulders and thus allows for great freedom of movement without feeling the full weight of the camera, binoculars or rangefinder.

This product is perfect for hunting as your rangefinder and binoculars are easy to retrieve without making a noise and there is no more effort in carrying them around.

Trekking products are supplied with a two-year guarantee. All products are simple to use and come with instructions inside the packaging. One size fits most people! It is suitable for all cameras, binoculars and rangefinders.

#### Product evaluation by Adrian de Villiers:

This trekking harness is good for all kinds of outdoor activities and is especially useful for bow hunters, bird watchers and peeping Toms. It very comfortably holds ones expensive binoculars, and camera (mine is in a small shockproof and waterproof case, camouflaged with "Sniper camo tape"). Both are in a handy position on the harness and there are additional lanyards (fancy way of saying strong string with a clip on it) for a rangefinder. I do not use one as I have an integral one built into my binoculars (Leica Geovid). I was given a harness to test by Neil Massey who is importing them at the present time. This last weekend I walked for four days with clients on a walk-and-stalk course and found it to be very comfortable even after 10 hours of walking. The binoculars can be used without them making contact or touching

the camera case and the opposite is true as well. The hard plastic protective case is in easy reach when I need to remove the camera. I have added the stabbing knife with some cable ties to my left shoulder strap and it faces downwards for easy retrieval. I found that I could even climb under fences, through fences or over fences with the harness on. I recommend that bow hunters out there who have cameras and rangefinders in various difficult-to-access pockets, look at these harnesses as an option, especial if they also carry binoculars. Most importantly the item is very reasonably priced despite the weak rand.

### Slik Tips

If you want to make pulling arrows out of foam or 3D-targets a much easier and less straining job you



should give the Slik Tips a try. Slick Tip screw-in practice points for carbon arrows from Satellite Archery or Trophy

Ridge or Bear Archery products with their slightly larger diameter than an arrow shaft are designed with a Teflon insert that reduces the amount of strength required for the removal of arrows from targets. This specialty makes them much more comfortable than traditional practice points. Besides that they have a very precise flight because they are also well manufactured. They come in a pack of six and have accurate weights of 100 grains or 125 grains. They are a good buy. I personally do not want to be without them anymore.
